GO-04/005-Changes to the Line of
Approval

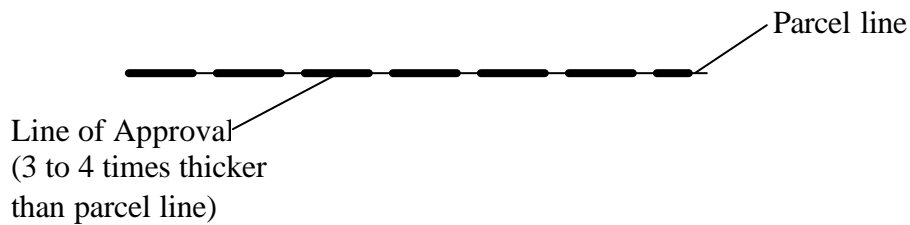

Policy:

Section 16 (2) of *The Land Surveys Regulations* states "A line of approval must be represented by a bold line". A bold line used for the line of approval on a plan will be shown as a **dashed** line approximately three to four times thicker than any other lot or parcel boundary. It must clearly demarcate the perimeter boundary of the approval area of the plan.

The line of approval must be shown directly **on** the perimeter boundary of the approval area of the plan and must not cover or obliterate any survey information including measurements and monument symbols.

For the definition of "**line of approval**" refer to Section 16(1)(b) of *The Land Surveys Regulations*.



Policy Justification:

This policy should eliminate or minimize confusion in determining the approval areas of plans in highly congested areas.
