



**Registrars' Order**

***The Personal Property Security Act, 1993, and  
The Operation of Public Registry Statutes Act.***

**Regarding Recommencement of Personal Property Registry Services**

Whereas subsection 15(1) of *The Operation of Public Registry Statutes Act* reads as follows:

15(1) Notwithstanding any other Act or law, if, in the opinion of a registry officer or the minister, the circumstances are such that it is not practical to provide one or more registry services or functions, a registry officer or the minister may, by order, suspend all or any registry services or functions for the period during which, in the opinion of the registry officer or the minister, those circumstances prevail.

Therefore I, Sheri A. Hupp, Registrar of Personal Property Security do hereby determine that the following applies to the recommencement of the Personal Property Registry:

**The recommencement of services and functions related to the Personal Property Registry are as follows:**

- ***Personal Property Registrations that expired between December 7, 2016 and December 15, 2016.***  
With the service disruption, a registrant in the personal property registry may have lost the opportunity to extend a registration with an automatic expiry date.

Therefore, where the actual date of expiry selected by the registrant for a registration occurred between 7:05 a.m. on Wednesday, December 7, 2016 and 11:30 p.m. on Tuesday, December 13, 2016, that registration is deemed to have remained effective as follows:

*Time Extensions for personal property registrations:*

<b>Original Expiry</b>	<b>Extended Expiry</b>
Wednesday, December 7	Monday, December 19
Thursday, December 8	Monday, December 19
Friday, December 9	Tuesday, December 20
Monday, December 12 (including weekend of December 10,11)	Wednesday, December 21
Tuesday, December 13	Thursday, December 22
Wednesday, December 14	Friday, December 23
Thursday, December 15	Wednesday, December 28

- **Personal Property Registrations with an expiring time period between December 7, 2016 and December 15, 2016.**

With the service disruption, a registrant in the personal property registry may have lost the opportunity to meet the requirements of an expiring time period.

Therefore, where there was an expiration of a time period pursuant to *The Personal Property Security Act, 1993* or regulations that occurred between 7:05 a.m. on Wednesday, December 7, 2016 and 11:30 p.m. on Tuesday, December 13, 2016, that time period is deemed to have been extended as follows:

*Time Period Extensions for personal property registrations:*


<b>Original Expiry</b>	<b>Extended Expiry</b>
Wednesday, December 7	Monday, December 19
Thursday, December 8	Monday, December 19
Friday, December 9	Tuesday, December 20
Monday, December 12 (including weekend of December 10,11)	Wednesday, December 21
Tuesday, December 13	Thursday, December 22
Wednesday, December 14	Friday, December 23
Thursday, December 15	Wednesday, December 28

A registration or any amendment to or renewal or discharge of a registration that was effected during the extended time period set out above is deemed to have the same effect as if the registration or the amendment to or renewal or discharge of the registration were effected within the original time period set out in *The Personal Property Security Act, 1993* or regulations.

**This order does not apply to judgments registered pursuant to *The Enforcement of Money Judgments Act*.**

This order is retroactive and is deemed to have been in force on and from December 13, 2016.
